Synopsis of NEET - PG 2020 Result

NBE has conducted NEET-PG 2020 on 05/01/2020 in 169 cities across the country on a computer -based platform. NEET-PG is the only eligibility cum entrance examination for admission to all medical post graduate courses in the country. The following medical post graduate seats shall be filled utilizing the merit list of NEET-PG:

- All India 50% quota seats
- Institutions of central Govt.
- Armed Forces Medical Services Institutions
- Universities established by an Act of Parliament
- Deemed universities
- State quota seats
- Seats in private medical colleges
- Institutions established by State Govt. or by an Act of State
- Post –MBBS DNBSeats

Admission to PG courses in the following medical Institutions are not through NEET-PG:

- AIIMS, New Delhi and other AIIMS
- PGIMER, Chandigarh
- JIPMER, Puducherry
- NIMHANS, Bengaluru
- Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Science and Technology, Trivandrum

NEET Percentile = [(Total no. of candidates appearing - NEET Rank) / Total no. of candidates appearing] x 100

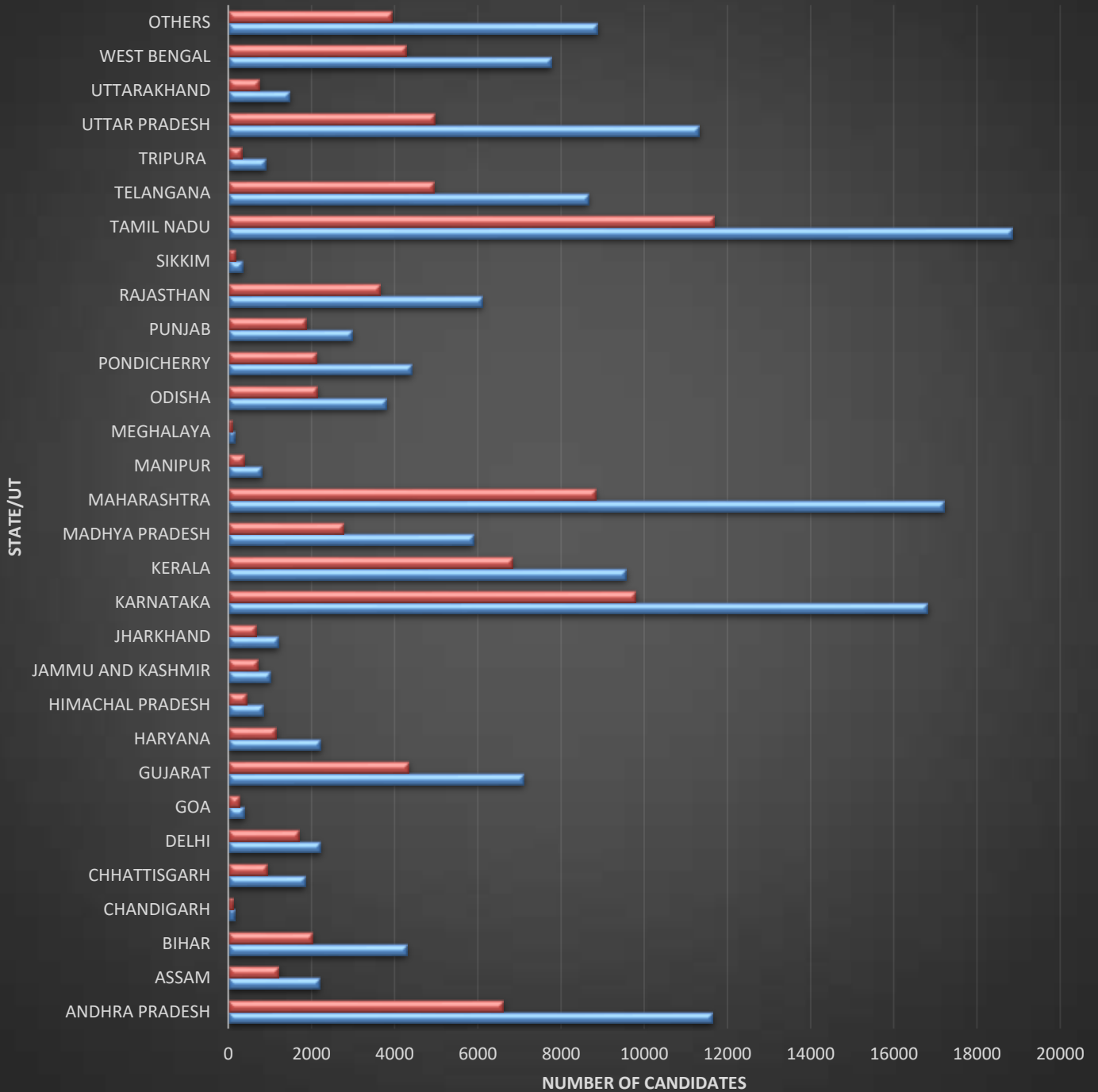

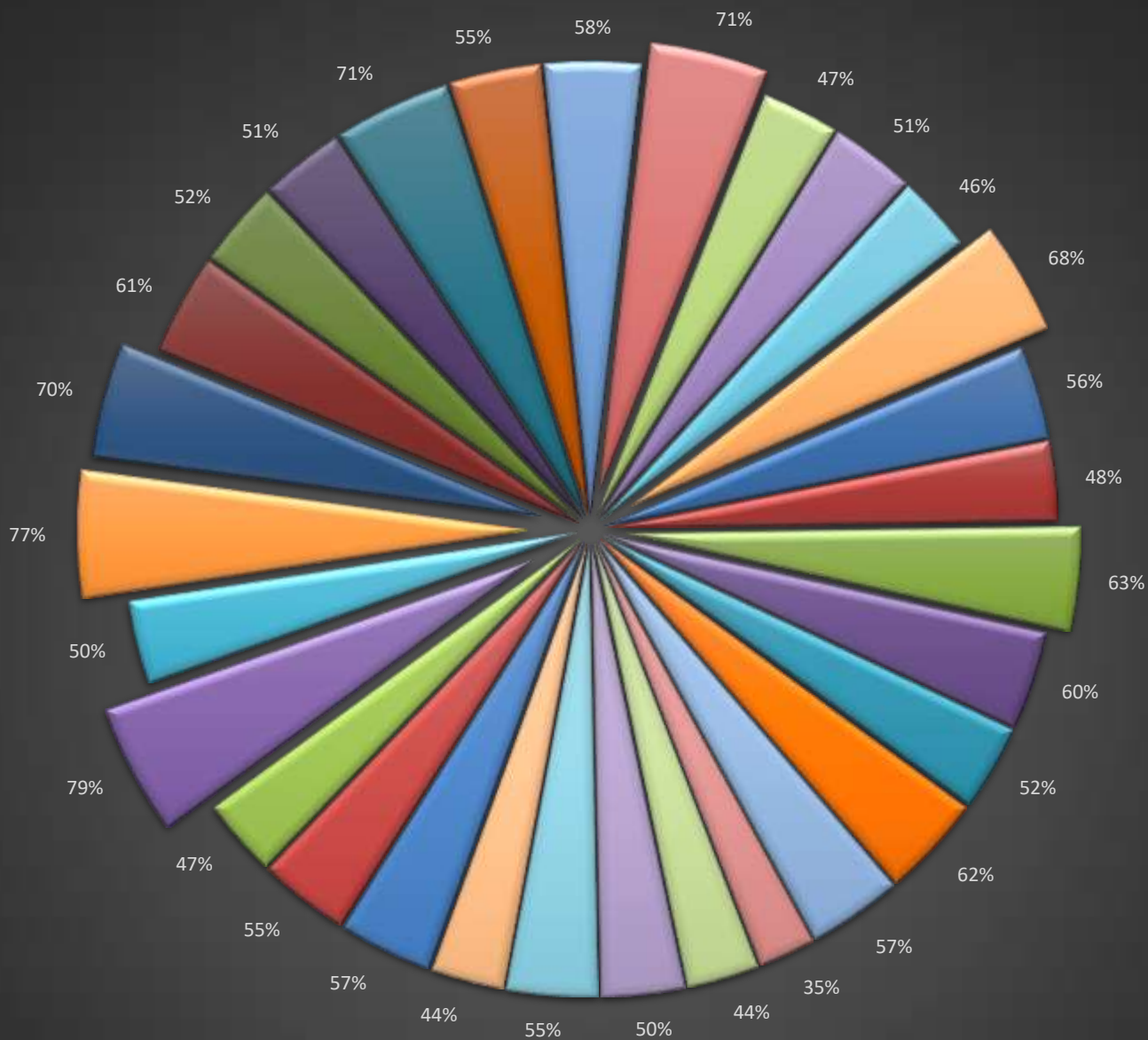

Conclusion for State-Wise Qualified Students Under 10000 (10K) (Over and Above 705 Marks/1200) Rank In NEET PG-2020

1. Kerala and Tamil Nadu have more than 1,000 qualified
2. State with more than 5000 + students appeared and 10% or less qualified is Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka
3. Kerala is the best performing state with more than 19 % scoring above 10000 rank (705+ Marks) with 9000 + appeared student
4. Bihar and MP with less than 10% qualified for below 10000 rank
5. Haryana highest percent(28%) of student qualified under 10000 rank
6. Other Best performing states are Chandigarh -18%, Delhi -15%, Goa -19%, Jharkhand -16% and Uttar Pradesh -13%

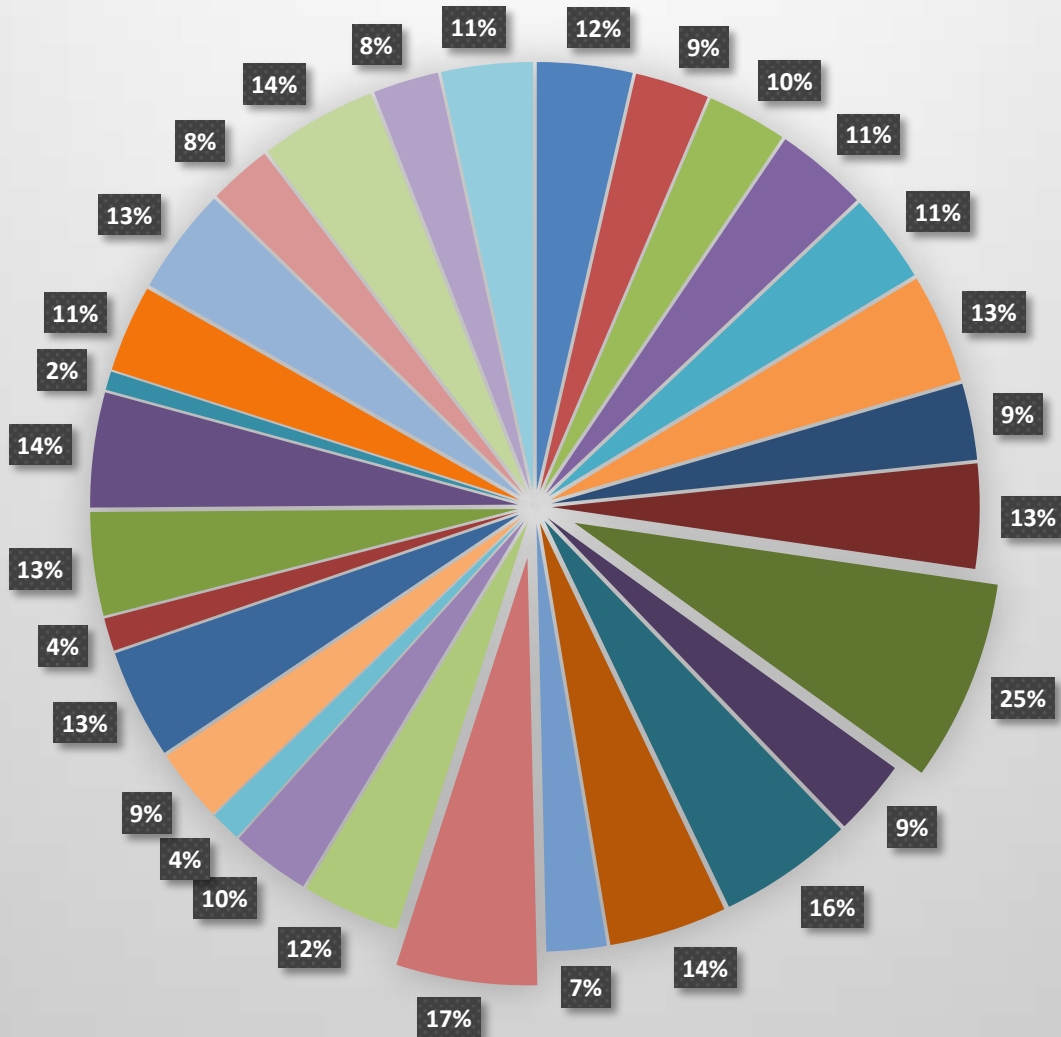
IMPACT IN TERMS OF COUNSELING & ADMISSION – As per the detailed analysis of I3C experts

- If you see these statistical analysis under 10000, maximum number of students qualified are from Kerala and number of seats are less and more number of caste and religious division exists. So more number of students will apply for All India MCC Counseling.
- Next state where more number of students applying for MCC are from Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana. Usually students who score > 6000 and < 10000 rank are generally quite confused in securing seats and who are looking for clinical subjects like MD Radiology, MD Dermatology, MD General Medicine. As in Deemed university, fees are very high so students securing the seat in first round are applying even in state counseling.
- You might find that these students will be jumping from State to Central Counselling and Central to state Counselling very regularly.
- Most of the students are looking for seat in their own state that is another reason why student jumps from Central Counselling to State Counselling and vice versa.
- Another major reason is the desired branch the students are looking @ affordable fees.

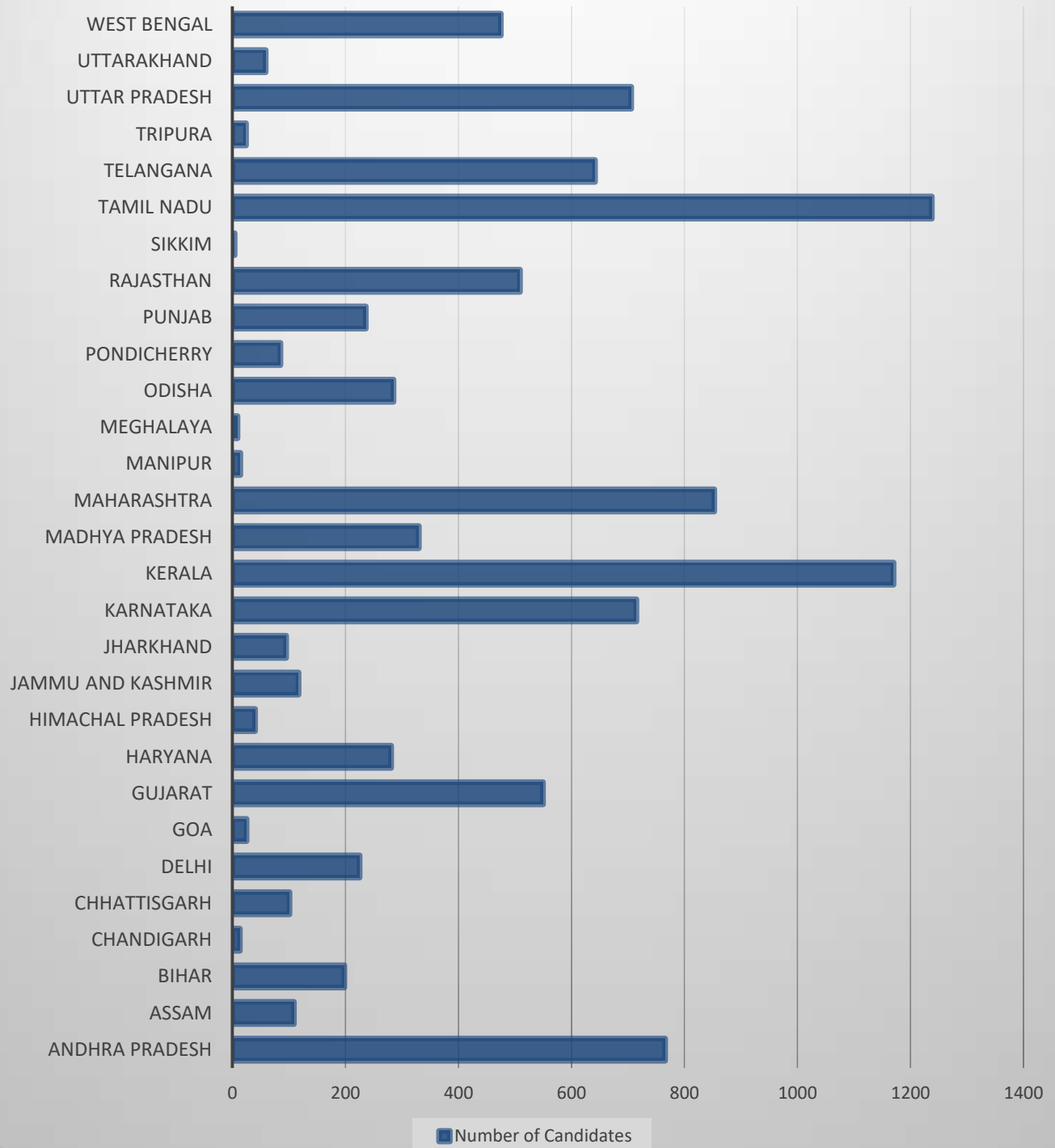

- 1) Kerala is the best state where 17% of students have scored between 10k-20k amongst 9000+ appeared in Examination.
- 2) Haryana is the best performing state with more than 25% have scored above 20000 rank
- 3) Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir have done good in the ranking compared to below 10000 rank category
- 4) More Than 50% Students score between 1-20k Rank From Haryana

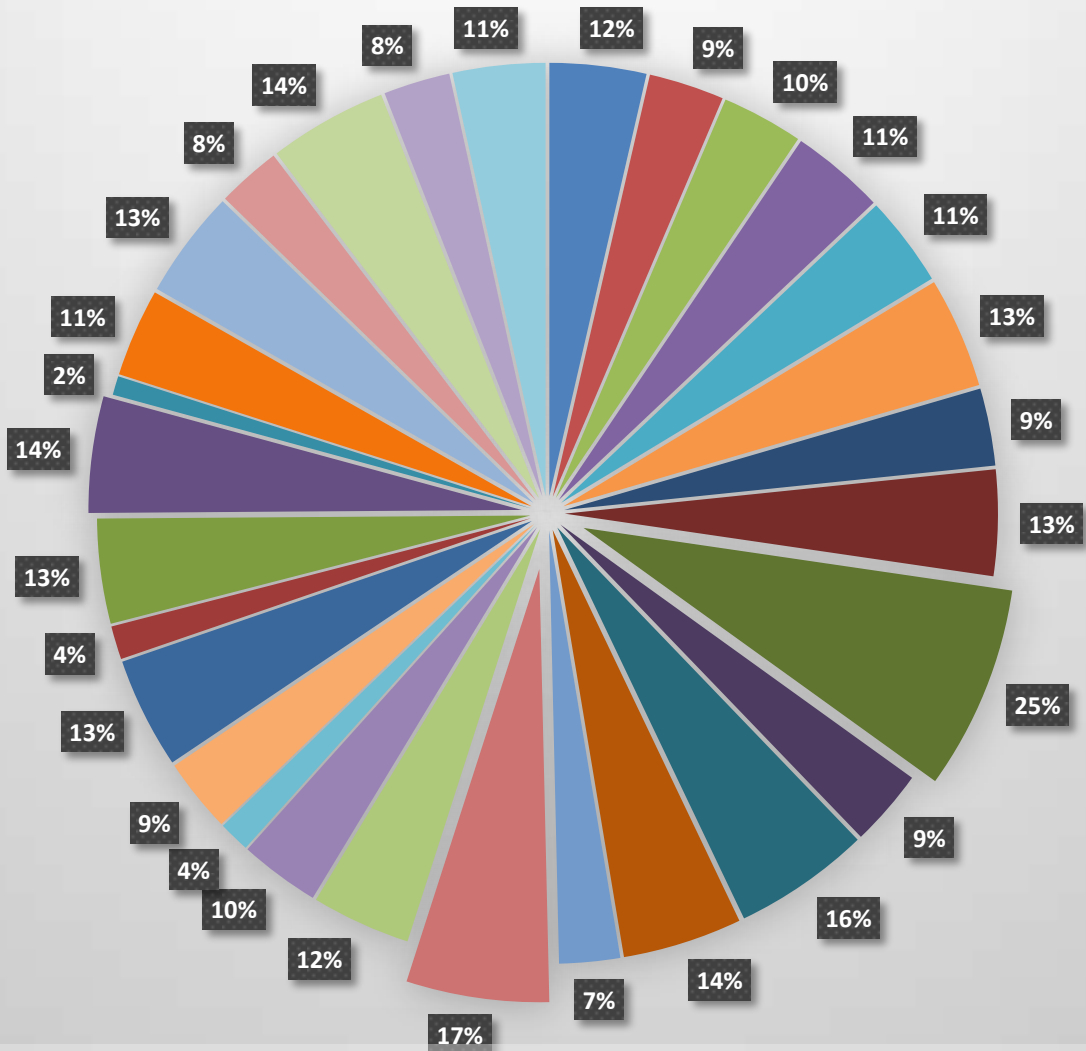
IMPACT IN TERMS OF COUNSELING & ADMISSION – As per the detailed analysis of I3C experts

- Students scoring between 10,000 and 20,000 generally get seat in State Counselling (or) Deemed universities as most of the seats in All India Quota (AIQ) get over by the rank of 7000 to 8000.
- Students who are looking for the seats in Clinical branches like General Medicine and OBG, Pediatrics try either in Deemed Universities or in the State Counseling.
- People who are looking for seat in MD Radiology or MD Dermatology find it difficult to get seat below the fee structure of 30 lakhs per year.
- So if you see, most of the students who qualify under this category are from Kerala, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu.
- Students from Karnataka, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu apply in the Deemed University as maximum number of Deemed Universities are in Karnataka, Maharashtra & Tamil Nadu.
- For students from Rajasthan, Haryana, Gujarat, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Clinical seats are available for this rank for same fees as in Deemed universities which is 20 to 30 lakhs per year in Private colleges of their states.

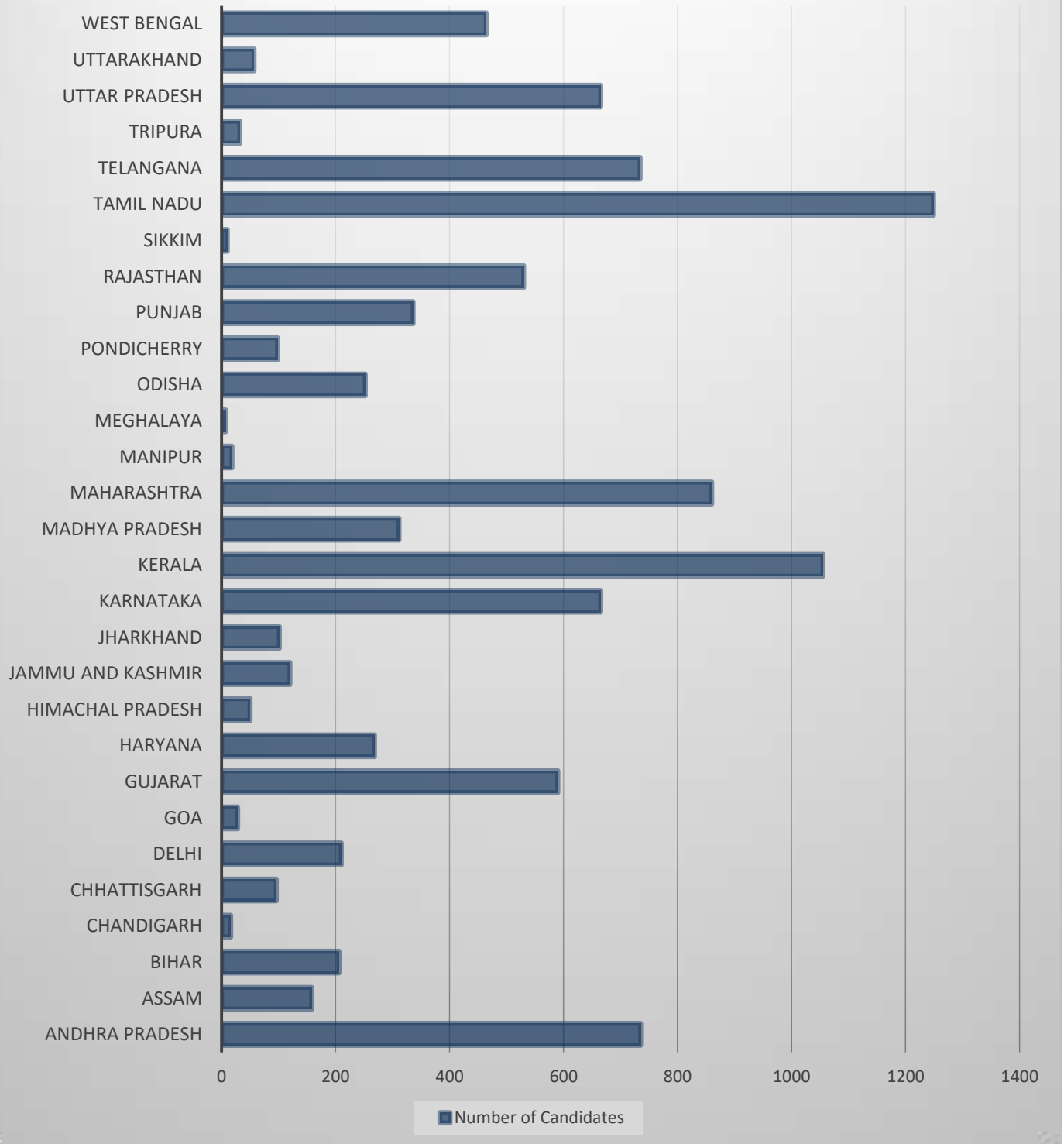

Conclusion for State Wise Qualified Students Between 20K-30K Rank (630-571 Marks/1200)In NEET PG-2020

- 1) In Haryana More Than 75% Students Scored between 1-30K Rank
- 2) More Than 50% Plus & Highest Number of 3500+ Students Score Between 1-30K Ranks From Kerala
- 3) From Jammu and Kashmir-17% , Punjab-18% ,Telangana-15% and Uttar Pradesh13% students scored good
- 4) Students from Andhra Pradesh ,Chhattisgarh, Chandigarh, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana, Odisha and Jammu and Kashmir done averagely good in comparison with other states

IMPACT IN TERMS OF COUNSELING & ADMISSION – As per the detailed analysis of I3C experts

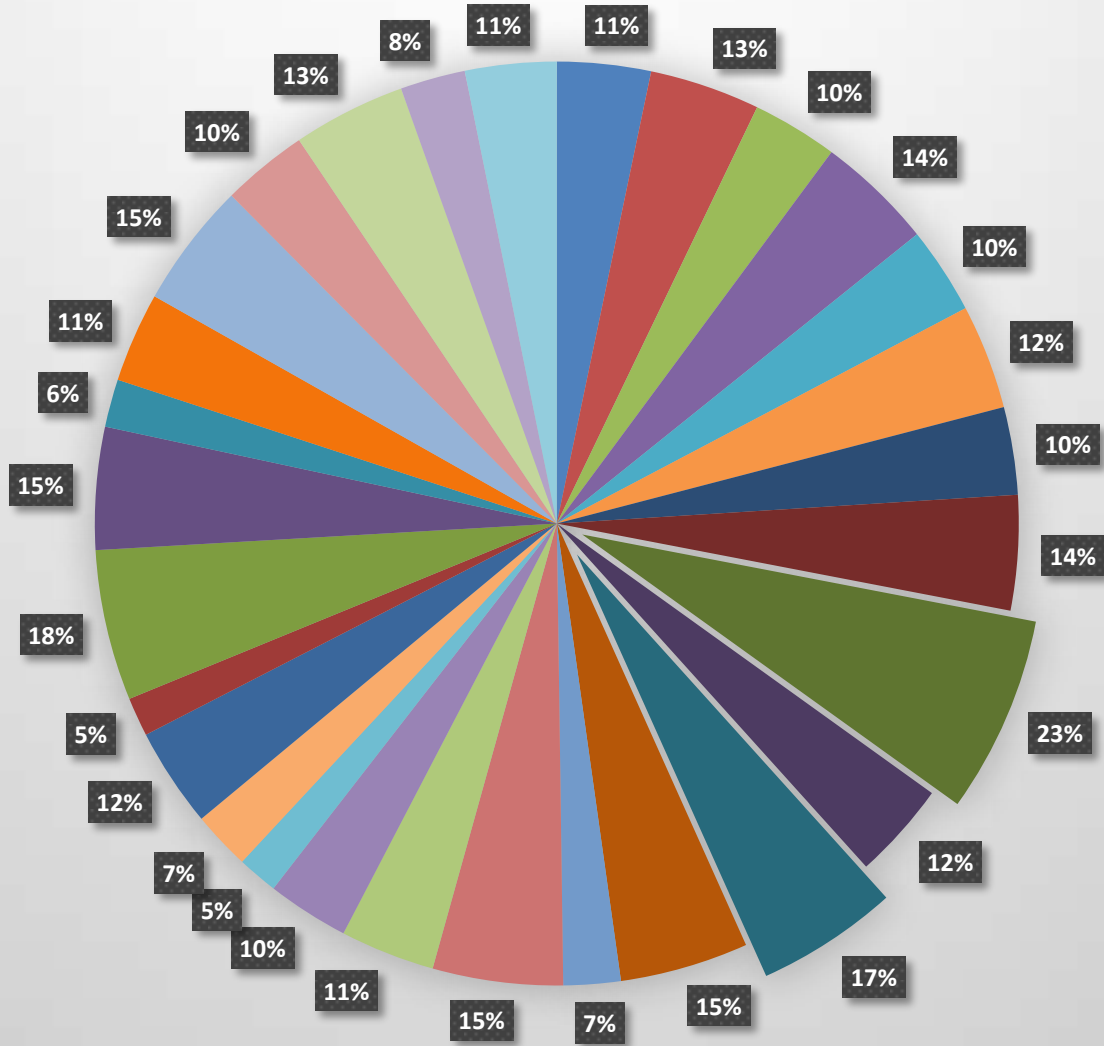
1. Students who score between 20K to 30K generally prefer taking seat in Deemed Universities, State Private Colleges. For Clinical branches like MD General Medicine, MD Paediatrics, MD/MS OBG, MS Orthopaedics , MS Surgery is 25 Lakhs+ and for MD Emergency & MD Pulmonary Medicine, the fee is 20 Lakhs+
2. Few subjects like MD Anesthesia and MD Psychiatry or MS Ophthalmology or MS ENT is available for 19Lakhs- 22Lakhs fees
3. Students must have patience as most of the students up to 20000 rank drop the seat after first round in Deemed University & State Counseling, whereas these students have good opportunity to take the seat for less fee structure in a good college
4. Pre and Para-Clinical subjects are available with the least fee structure till this rank
5. Student of these ranks must wait and apply in most of the state counseling process across India to get better seat for a low price.
6. Students of this category who are looking for seat of MD Radiology or Dermatology must attend stray vacancy round. The trend is that students' with rank in this range get the seat for very low fee structure like 20 to 25 Lakh in good Deemed University.

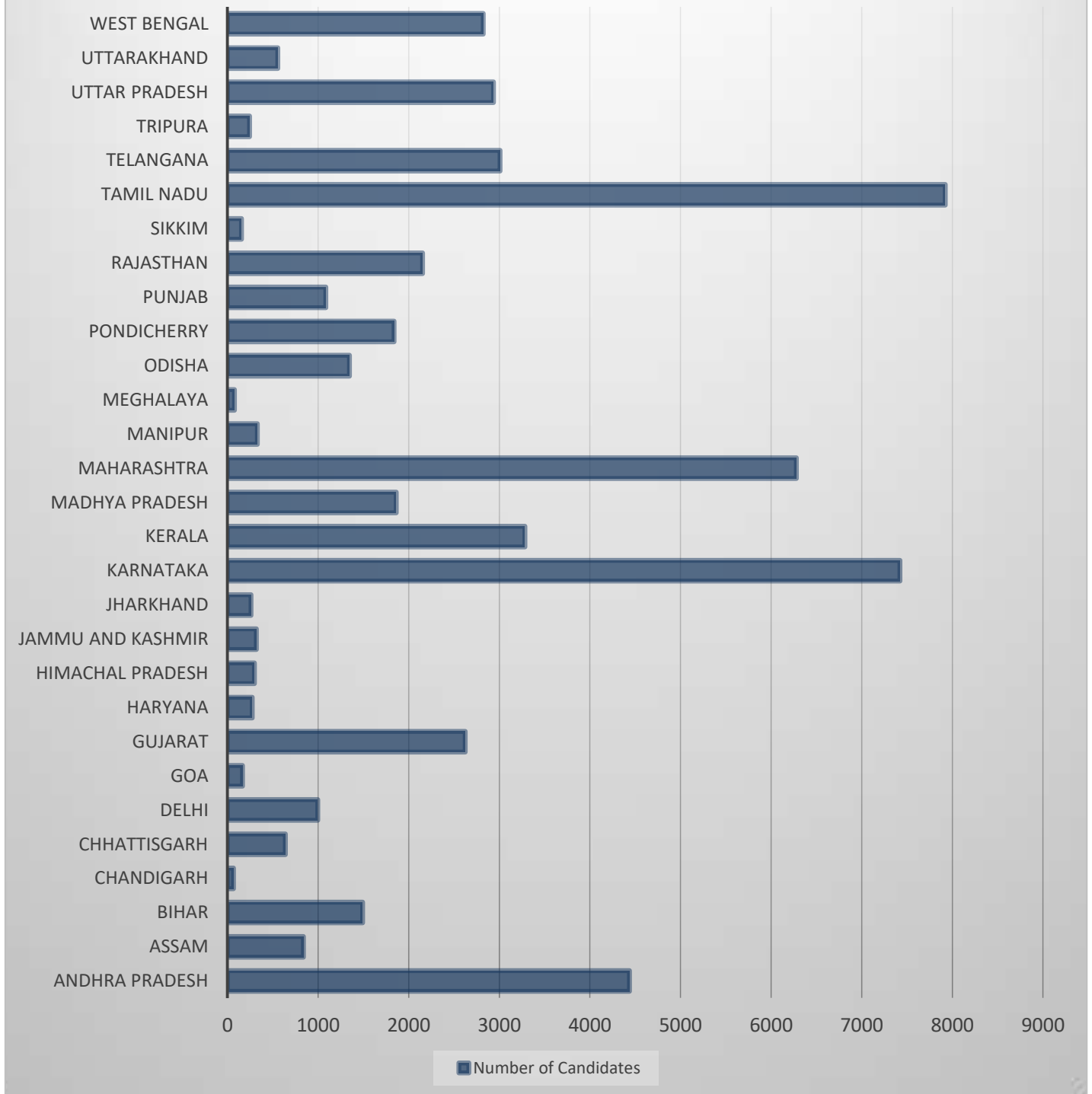

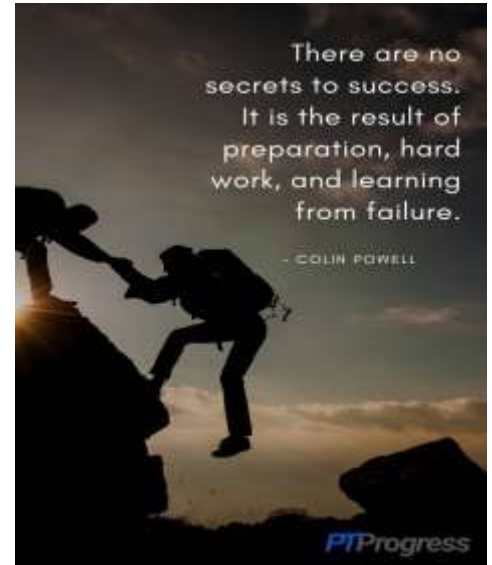
1. In Karnataka, Tamil Nadu & Maharashtra more than 6000+ students have more than 30000 Rank.
2. Andhra Pradesh, Telangana more than 3000+ students have qualified with more than 30000 Rank.
3. 70% students have scored more than 30K rank from all these states - Sikkim-88%, Manipur-89%, Uttarakhand-75%, Tripura-75%, Meghalaya-76%, Maharashtra-71%, Karnataka-76%, Bihar-74%, Assam-70%

IMPACT IN TERMS OF COUNSELING & ADMISSION – As per the detailed analysis of I3C experts

1. Students with above 30000 rank, get seat in branches like MD General Medicine, MD Paediatrics, MD/MS OBG, MS Orthopaedics, MS Surgery, with a fee structure to 35 lakhs+
2. MD Anesthesia, MD Psychiatry or MS Ophthalmology or MS ENT subjects are available with the fee structure of approximately 19-22 Lakhs till 40000 rank after that fees structure goes to 22 to 25 lakhs per year till 45,000 rank
3. Upto 50K rank students, can get MD General Medicine, MD Paediatrics, MD/MS OBG ,MS Orthopaedics, MS Surgery with a fee structure of 48 to 55 lakhs per year in Deemed University and State Counseling
4. These Rank students must have high level of patience as they generally get seat only in the final round of counseling which is mop-up round or extended mop-up round. There are very high chances that they may get good seat in stray vacancy round conducted by the colleges after mop-up round
5.
